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- Created in 1952 through the Santiago Declaration
- Coordinate maritime policies of member States : CHILE, COLOMBIA, ECUADOR and PERÚ
- Institution specialized in maritime issues
- Is the Executive Secretary of the Southeast Pacific Action Plan, of which Panama is also Party

The Galapagos Commitment (2012)

- The Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the Member Countries reaffirmed the Organization's commitment to regional cooperation in view of the new common challenges of the XXI century.
- CPPS will support Member Countries to achieve in an integral perspective their sustainable development, taking into account, among others, the ecosystems approach, the precautionary principle and the international instruments aimed at the protection of seas and oceans, respecting national policies and mechanisms in effect in each country. This orientation applied in the areas of sovereignty and jurisdiction of Member States of the CPPS, will also guide its projection beyond that zone, including the Pacific basin.

- Ecosystem approach (food security and poverty alleviation)
- Variability and climate change

- Management of living resources (fishing, aquaculture, including economic and social aspects)

Legal/Policy

- The conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity within the framework of the United Nations
- Prospecting, exploration and exploitation of the mineral resources of the zone under the International Seabed Authority (ISA)
- Following BBNJ process

Environmet

- Pollution (land-based sources, marine litter)
- Biodiversity (lost of biodiversity, MPA, Aichi Targets)
- Ecosystems services (mangroves)
- Integrated coastal mangement/ marine spatial planning
- Data management
