PROJECT OBJECTIVE



We support countries in creating and reinforcing existing biosphere reserves on the coastal areas and islands of the Pacific coast of Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Panama and Peru.

The project also aims to promote biosphere reserves as tools for innovative projects to bring added value to local socio-economical activities.

We sensitize and build the capacity of stakeholders on coastal biosphere reserve management and on the socio-economic values of the biosphere reserves.

- First Transboundary biosphere reserve from South America between Ecuador and Peru First biosphere reserves in the Colombian Pacific (to be approved in 2019)
- 3 young representatives from Chile, Ecuador and Peru participated in the First MAB Youth Forum in Italy in 2017
- 1 million ha added to the Noroeste Biosphere Reserve (now Noroeste-Amotapes-Manglares)
